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## **Biography**

George Glass is a nurse researcher at Tan Tock Seng Hospital. His undergraduate nursing training was at the University of Edinburgh. He focused on quantitative research methodology and regression modelling in his Master of Science of Medicine (Clinical Epidemiology) at the University of Sydney. He is currently pursuing the Foundations in Artificial Intelligence Programme with Al Singapore.

His work is focused on caregivers of older persons, aimed towards 'improving care for the (informal) carer'. Together with other nurse researchers, he has examined the potential protective effect of caregiver mastery on the stress of caregiving, and the unique experiences of different caregiver personas. These findings guided the development of a holistic hospital-to-home support system for caregivers at TTSH.

He was one of the first nurse researchers to explore patient activation, examining predictors for a patient's knowledge, skills and confidence for effective management of their conditions and self-care.

With NGEMR, he has been active in applying data extraction and analysis to gain better insights in patient care as well, currently examining a cohort of caregivers and their loved ones post-discharge.

He is currently leading the development of a mobile application to better equip and enable caregivers of older persons. This includes the development of recommendation systems to 'push' appropriate content to users based on their profiled needs.
