Biography

Dr. Liu Jianlin is a Research Fellow at the Institute of Mental Health (IMH). He has experience in leading research studies on traumatic stress and mental health. Dr. Liu obtained his PhD from the Yong Loo Lin School of Medicine, National University of Singapore under the President's Graduate Fellowship (Lee Kong Chian Scholarship). As part of his doctoral dissertation, Dr. Liu was the Principal Investigator (PI) of a local study on trauma and psychosis; the research findings were published in 6 reputable international journals in psychiatry and clinical psychology. In addition to clinical research on trauma, Dr. Liu had analyzed population-based data on adverse childhood experiences and protective psychological resources from the 2016 Singapore Mental Health Study; the research findings were published in the leading Asia Pacific journal (Australian and New Zealand Journal of Psychiatry) and he was awarded the 2021 Singapore Allied Health Gold Award. Dr. Liu was also the first Asian recipient of the prestigious 2019 European Association of Psychosomatic Medicine (EAPM) Young Investigator Award for his first-authored published work on fear of cancer recurrence in the Journal of Psychosomatic Research. Most recently, Dr. Liu was awarded the competitive 2022 NMRC Open-Fund Young Individual Research Grant to advance knowledge in assessment and intervention for trauma and severe mental illness. Dr. Liu currently serves as on the editorial board of Journal of Traumatic Stress. He is also appointed as editorial fellow for the journal, Psychology Trauma.
